Congressional Issues

Congress raised the US debt ceiling by \$500 billion to \$28.9 trillion avoid a government shutdown and allows the federal government to pay obligations already incurred. It does not authorize new spending.

By a 50-48 vote, the US Senate voted to extend the government's borrowing authority to December 3 thus avoiding a federal default that many say would disrupt the economy (Sens Marco Rubio, Rick Scott voted NO). The House later voted to raise the debt ceiling 219-206 (Cong Michael Waltz voted NO).

The debt ceiling is money the federal government is allowed to borrow in order to pay its bills i.e. Social Security payments, military/federal employee salaries, and tax refunds (the US also has to pay interest on debt it has already taken out to pay older bills).

Congress is dealing with several other issues which involve the debt ceiling is a part of that....

- The debt ceiling issue—the debt ceiling is suspended through Dec. 3.
- The federal budget for FY 2021-22 —Congress has extended funding through December 3. The new fiscal year started on October 1.
- The \$3.5 trillion Build Back Better package, for health, safety net programs and the environment. It's stalled in Congress due to debate over its price tag.
 NOTE - the BBB act could provide 12 weeks of paid family/medical leave; and would cap childcare costs at 7% of income for middle-class families and aims to make preschool free for 3- and 4-year-olds.
- The \$1 trillion infrastructure bill.

On October 6, the Volusia Legislative delegation held its annual meeting to hear from the County, cities, and other local entities.

Senators Tom Wright, Jason Brodeur, Travis Hutson and Representatives Tom Leek, Webster Barnaby, Elizabeth Fetterhoff and Paul Renner heard community requests for the upcoming legislative session which starts January 11.

Speakers included Volusia County Chair Jeff Brower, Space Florida President Frank DiBello, Deland Mayor Bob Apgar, Daytona Regional Chamber's Shawn Richmond, CareerSource President Robin King Embry-Riddle Aeronautical Unv President Barry Butler, Daytona State College President Tom LoBasso, Team Volusia's Heather Shubirg, DeBary City Manager Carmen Rosamonda, Ponce Inlet Mayor Elect Lois Paritsky, Daytona Beach Govt Relations Director Hardy Smith, Ormond Beach City Manager Joyce Shanahan Deltona Mayor Heidi Herzberg, Port Orange Mayor Don Burnette, Oak Hill Mayor Doug Gibson and others.

Florida's NEW \$10 per hour minimum wage....As of September 30, Florida's NEW minimum wage increased from the current \$8.65 (\$17,800 per 40 work week) to \$10 per hour. The wage for tipped workers will increase to \$6.98. Florida's wage will increase \$1 each year until it reaches \$15 in 2026.

Special Events Task Force Begins Work....

On September 29, local police chiefs and city managers, the Sheriff, County Chair, County Manager and Volusia County Beach Safety officials began meeting to find means to address unpermitted social media events that create excessive noise. Entities involved were Holly Hill, Daytona Beach Shores, Ormond Beach, South Daytona, Port Orange, Ponce Inlet, New Smyrna Beach, Edgewater and Flagler Beach.

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
Ideas raised at this meeting included pursuing new state laws to significant hike in fines and using social media to caution uninvited partiers what they'll face from law enforcement if they show up and break laws.....vehicles towed and impounded.

Task force members discussed social media about Trucktoberfest on October 23, a cruising event with nothing organized. Daytona Beach City officials having already been seeking legal possibilities to quell unsanctioned special events.

The recent three-day Daytona Truck Meet saw some 5,000 oversized vehicles and 40,000 visitors....Daytona Beach police wrote 940 citations including seven DUIs, towed 25 vehicles and handled 13 crashes.

The task force was suggested by **DB City Commissioner Stacy Cantu**.


A Special Joint County Council/School Board meeting was held October 18. A final meeting will be held October 28.


The goals of both entities are similar — creating an even split between districts, not splitting cities, keeping current representatives' homes in the same districts and not splitting large groups of minorities. At the same time, the School Board wants to keep schools in their same districts.

Upon agreement at the October 28 meeting, staff will draft an ordinance

between November 2 and 24. Both the County Council and School Board are scheduled to approve the final map by December 14. (County Council meets December 7 and School Board meets December 14).
