Congressional News

Build Back Better? With the stalemate in the Senate, President Biden's Build Back Better is at a standstill. However, he has suggested that lawmakers dice Build Back Better into chunks.

If Democrats pursue to go the budget reconciliation route, it would be exempt from filibusters. However, the Senate while in the 50/50 status, won't like see further action if **W Virginia Senator Joe Manchin** and **Arizona Senator Kyrsten Sinema** won't support eliminating the filibuster.



Meanwhile, **Senator Marco Rubio** stated, “This is not a plan to ‘Build Back Better,’ this is a plan to ‘Build Back Socialist” (October 28, 2021). He expressed concern that the bill would hurt Florida hospitals, especially those that treat low-income residents and the uninsured. He signed on to a letter asking the Congressional Budget Office how the bill would affect states that did not expand Medicaid under the Affordable Care Act.

Senator Rick Scott stated, “Until we get inflation under control, we've got to put Build Back Better on hold. There's a day of reckoning for all this debt” (December 13, 2021). He cited a report from the Univ of Pennsylvania's Wharton School of Business finding that President Biden's “Build Back Better” proposal would increase U.S. debt by nearly \$2.5 TRILLION.



Cong Michael Waltz stated "Build Back Better" will add trillions of dollars to our national debt and drive our existing social programs towards bankruptcy even faster, We already hold \$29 trillion in federal debt, spent nearly \$5 trillion in COVID-19 relief over the last two years (\$1 trillion is still unspent), and President Biden signed a \$1 trillion spending bill earlier this week.” (November 19, 2021).

House and Senate Propose FY 2022-23 Budgets...

On February 7, the **Senate Appropriations** Committee proposed a \$108.6 B budget for the next fiscal year..... [Sen Travis Hutson](#) voted **YES**.

Allocations are based on

- Human services: \$31.2B
- Criminal justice & corrections: \$40.3B
- Infrastructure: \$15.1B
- General gov't: \$18.3B
- Judicial branch: \$4.5B

The House proposed a \$105.3 B budget (PCB APC 22-01 General Appropriations Act) [Rep Tom Leek](#) [Rep Paul Renner](#) voted **YES**. Click here for a Summary

Allocations are based on

- Education: \$28B
- Human services: \$47.1B
- Criminal justice & corrections: \$5.3B
- Infrastructure: \$17B
- General Gov't: \$7.3B
- Judicial branch: \$635M

Once approved in Appropriations, both Senate and House budgets should go up for floor votes next week.

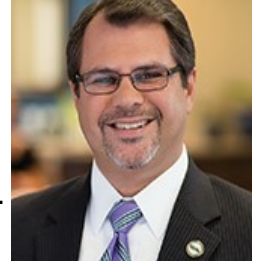

Pop Up Events Legislation Moving

[H 1435 Traffic & Code Enforcement/Pop Up Events](#) by [Rep Tom Leek](#) was approved by the House [Tourism Infrastructure Energy Subcommittee](#). The bill seeks to assist local governments in responding to pop-up e.g. Truck events by authorizing the sheriff or chief county/city official to designate a special event zone in response for unpermitted events organized/promoted via a social media and attended by 50 or more persons and increases/disrupts the normal flow of traffic.



It also prohibits excessive noise from motor vehicles. Next Stop is **Judiciary Committee** ([Rep Elizabeth Fetterhoff](#) – member).



The Senate version [S 1954](#) by [Sen Tom Wright](#) was approved by the **Community Affairs** (Sens [Jason Brodeur](#) and [Travis Hutson](#) – voted **YES**).

House & Senate Approve Legislative Districts...Congressional Districts on Hold

The Senate approved (**SJR 100**) 34-3 to set *their new lines* (**Sens Tom Wright, Travis Hutson, Jason Brodeur voted YES**). The House voted 77-39 for the same bill (**Reps Tom Leek, Elizabeth Fetterhoff, Paul Renner voted YES**)a combined bill that included Senate and House lines.

Attorney General Ashley Moody has 15 days to file a petition with the Supreme Court seeking a ruling on the validity of the redrawn legislative districts.

The court will have 30 days to issue an order, with opponents and the supporters of the maps able to file briefs.

With the legislative maps moving forward, work on the congressional map has stopped. The Senate, House and Governor's office are still negotiating final details for Florida's 28 districts.

The new legislative and congressional districts must be set prior to June 13... candidate qualification for this year's elections.

Please Contact House and Senate Members As Soon As Possible

In 2021, the Legislature permanently reduced monies going into the Sadowski Affordable Housing Trust Funds by 50%. This came with the promise in statute that after July 1, 2021,

all the remaining distributions thereafter to the trust funds would not be swept. The trust would be secure and utilized to fully fund the Sadowski Housing Programs (typically known as SHIP and SAIL).

The commitment was clear and understood by all parties. For Fiscal Year 21-22, the legislature kept the commitment and utilized all the monies in the housing trust funds for housing programs.

The House budget for FY 22-23 proposes only \$268.1 million for housing programs, which is substantially short of full appropriation.

County Council members and staff allocate ARPA Funds

County Council Allocates Federal Funds

The County Council held a workshop on February 1 to allocate \$107.5 million in coronavirus relief the county recently received under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The Council had to consider NEW US Treasury guidelines which led to expenditure changes. However, a significant portion was allotted to infrastructure. SOME of the agreed upon expenditures included.....

- **Southwest Regional Water Reclamation Facility** : \$18.4 million
- **Flood Control Projects** - \$10.5 million
- **Southeast Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant**: \$6.6 million
- **Juvenile Assessment Ctr**: \$5.4 million
- **Broadband enhancements**: \$5 million.

- **Emergency Vehicle Operators Course**: \$5 million
- **Low Income Housing repair program**: \$4 million
- **Marine Science Center improvements**: \$2.9 million
- **Affordable housing**: \$2.5 million
- **4-Laning Williamson (Beville Rd to Madeline Ave)**: \$2.3 million
- **Beach renourishment facility study**: \$1.5 million
- **Small Business Resource Center**: \$1 million
- **Veterans Homeless Shelter**: \$1 million

The County Council will FINALIZE these decisions at their February 15 meeting.

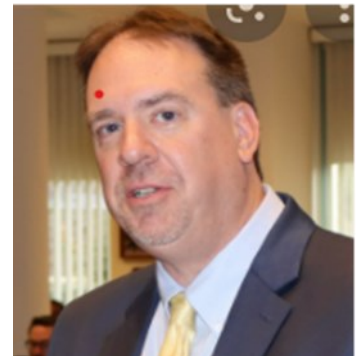

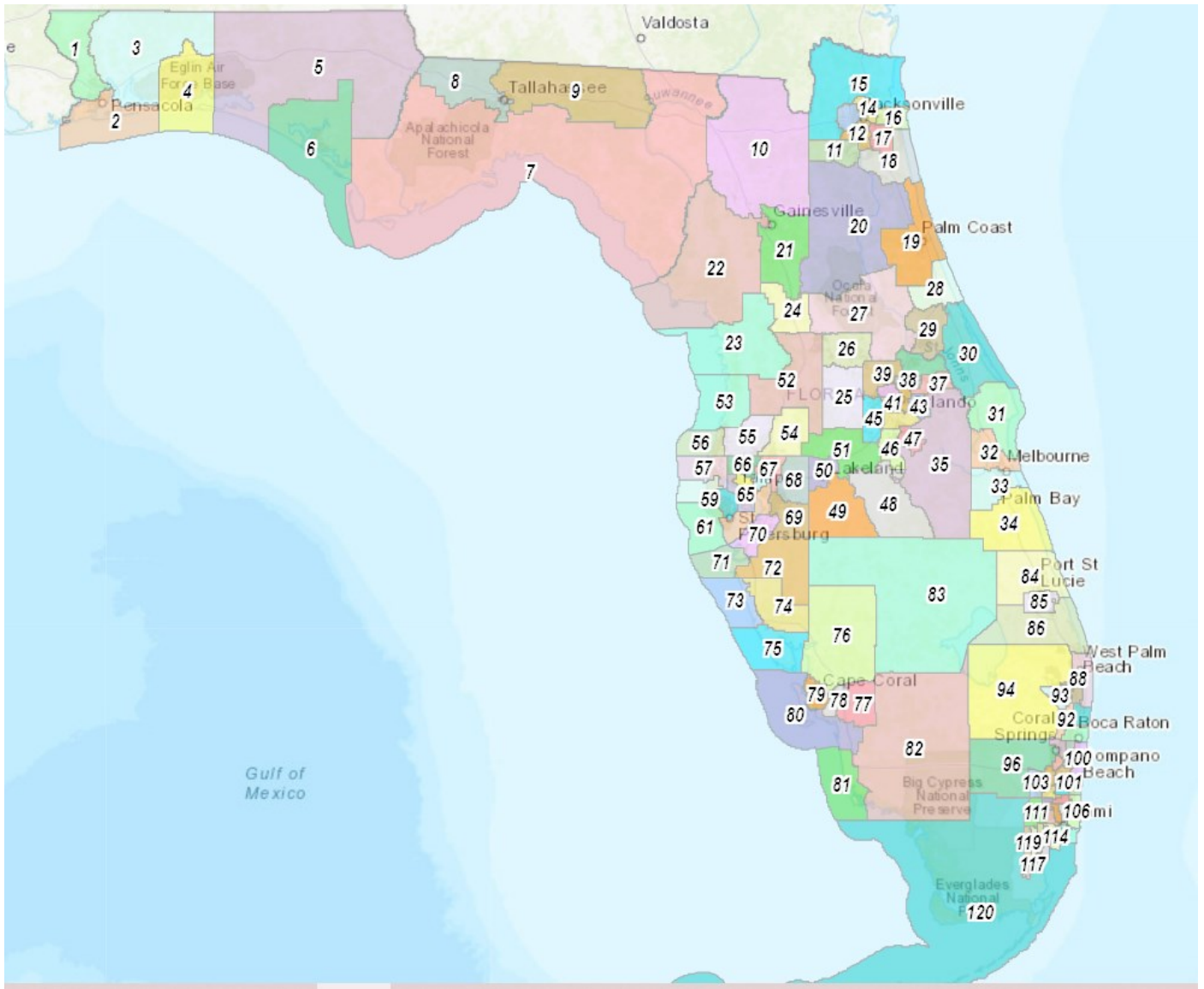

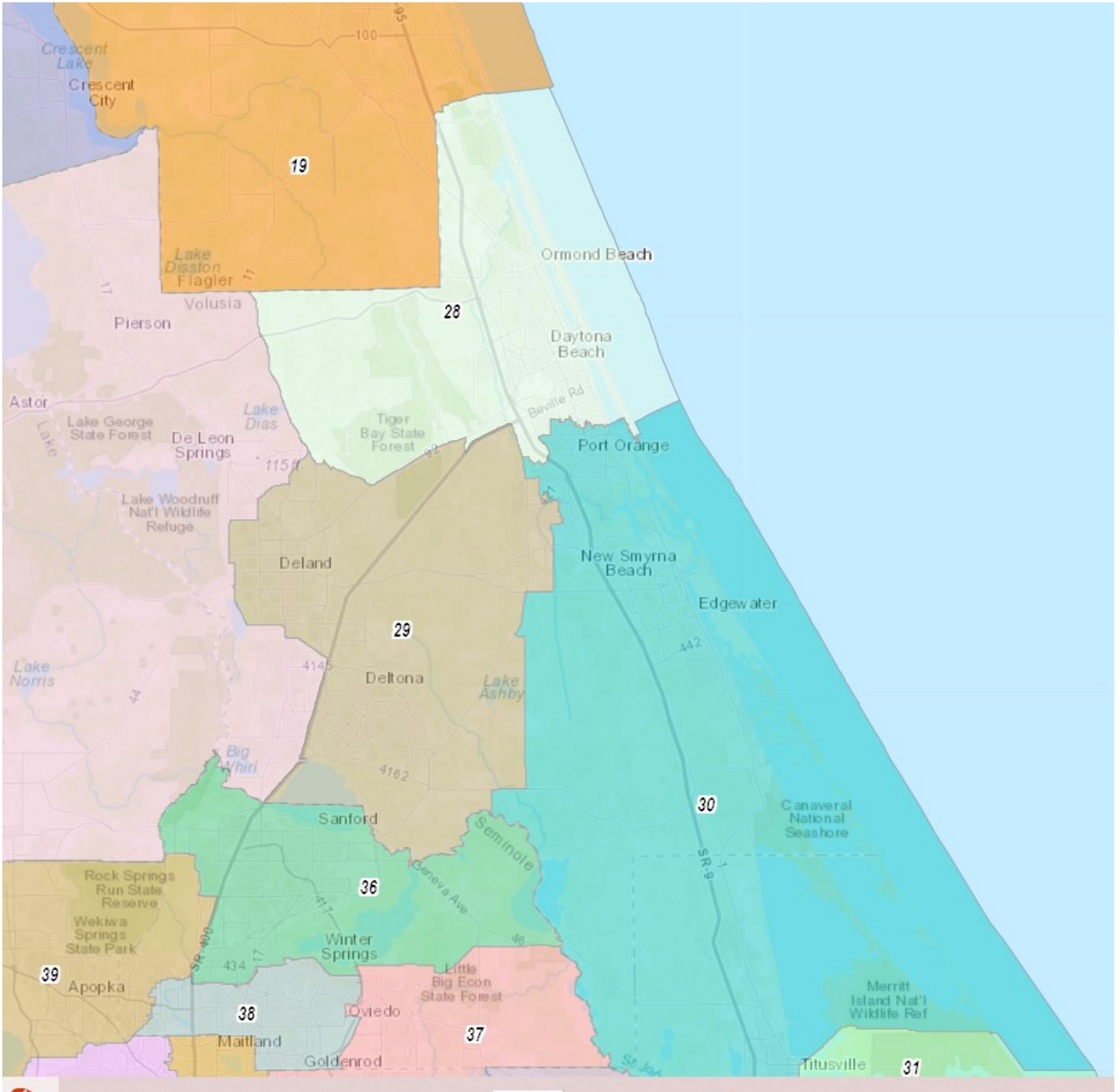
Proposed Florida House Districts Map



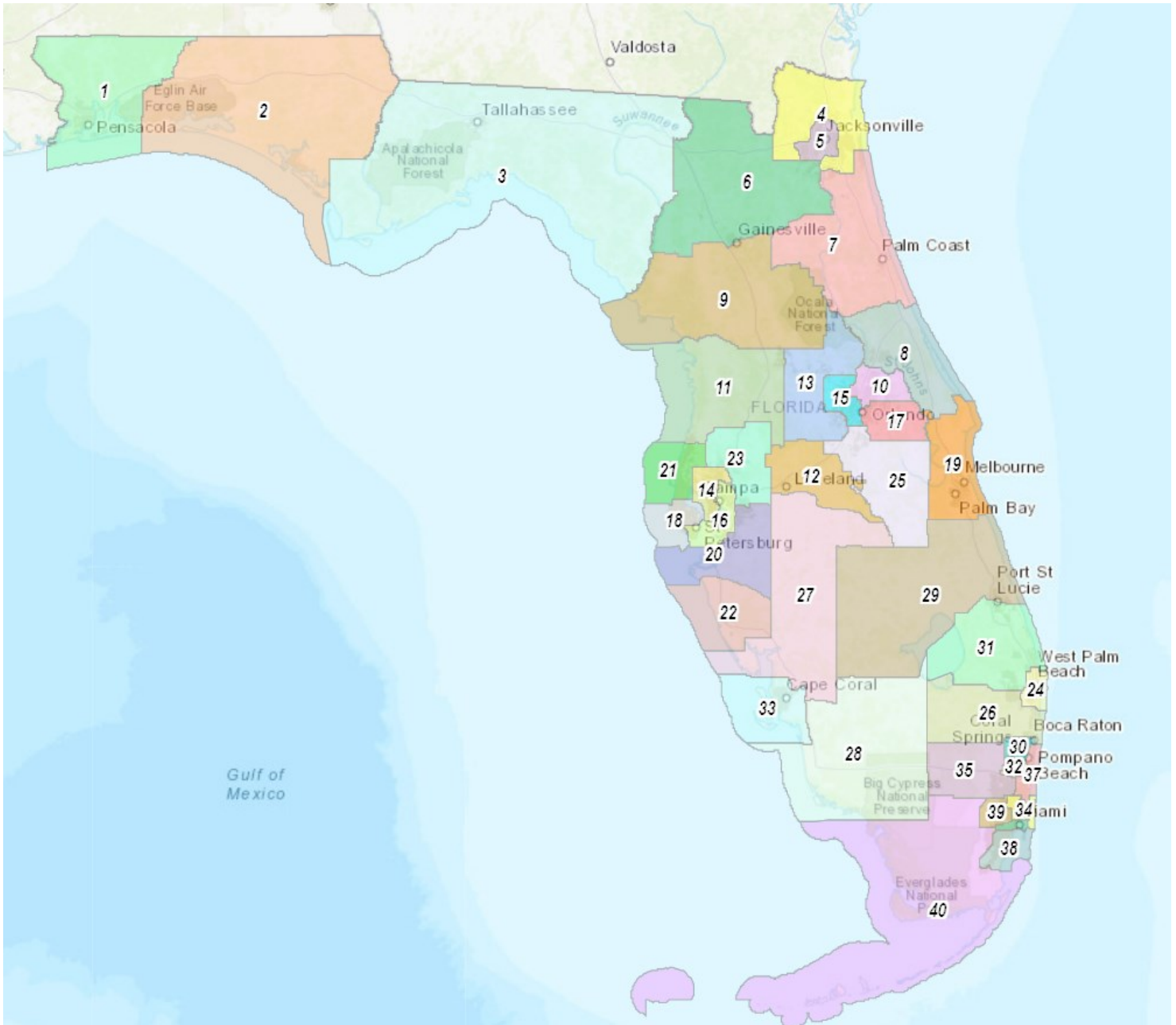

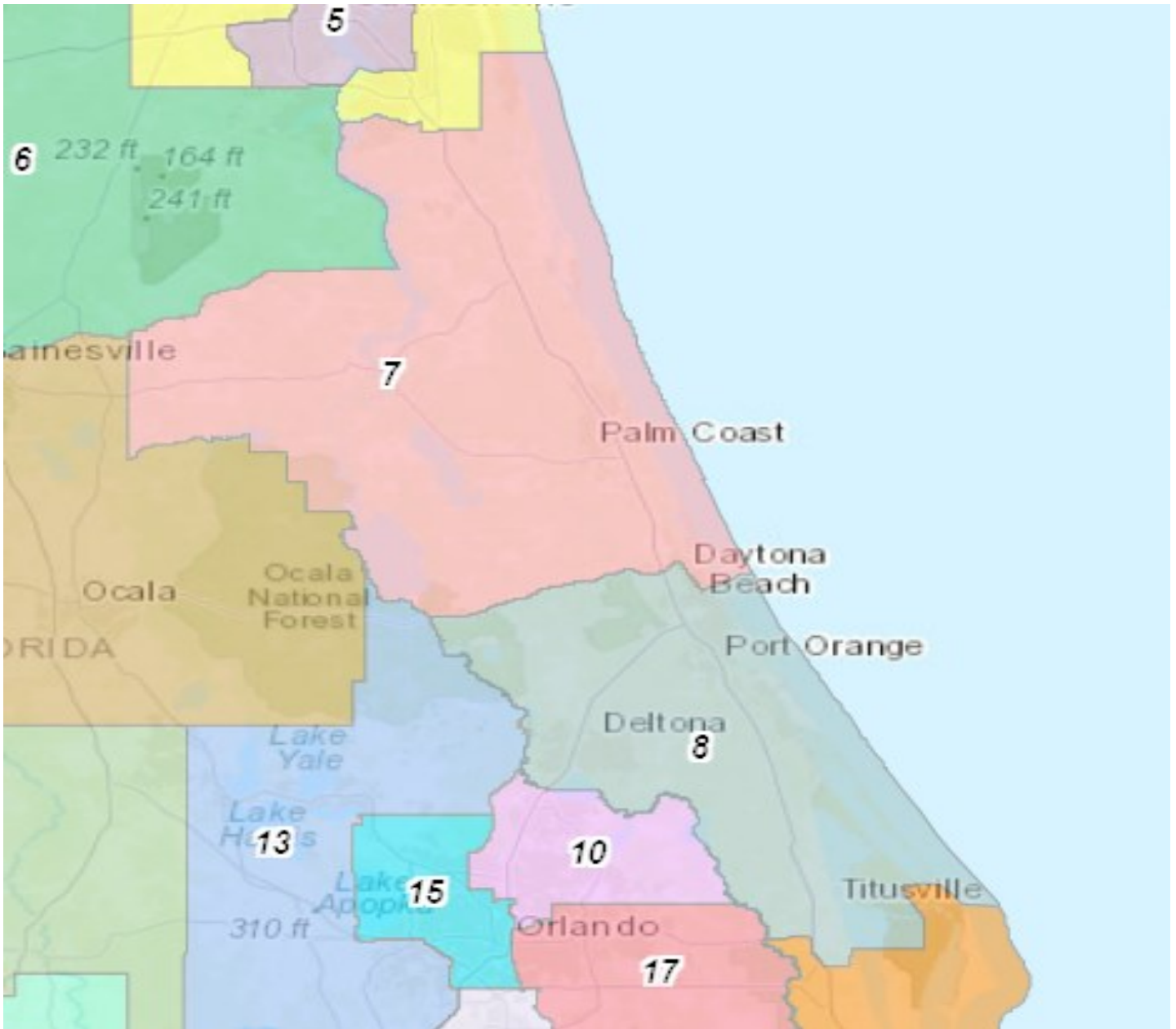
Proposed Florida Senate Districts Map
