News from Tallahassee

Gov DeSantis
Calls Special
Session to Draw
Congressional
Districts Map

Legislators will hold a Special Session **April 19-22** to redraw the congres-



sional map after **Gov DeSantis** vetoed the one they recently approved. Their goal will be to draw a new congressional map that meets the Governor's & Supreme Court's approval.

A map must be approved and resulting lawsuits must be resolved prior to the qualifying period for Congressional candidates (June 13 – 17). NOTE - Florida is also creating a new 28th district because of population growth.

During the Session, the Senate did not take the governor's map into consideration, and the House approved two maps: a primary map to try to address DeSantis' concern and a second map in case the first map was found to be unconstitutional.

DeSantis said, "We're not going to have a map drawn by a court." However, any map approved must meet the terms of the Fair District (Constitutional) Amendment approved by voters in 2010.

Outcome of Legislative Session

The legislative session ran an extra day to officially adjourn on Monday, March 14 upon approving the FY 2022-23 budget.

Overall, 285 bills were approved and sent to the Governor for approval.

Below is a list of bills that should be of interest to Volusia's local governments and business community.....

\$112 billion State budget <u>HB 5001</u> General Appropriations Act

It was supplemented by \$3.5 billion in federal stimulus funds.

DeSantis has final say over the budget including line item veto authority. But this budget includes many of his priorities so how much will he veto?

The budget includes......

- \$200 million monthlong cut to the state's gas tax in October;
- \$12 million to relocate undocumented immigrants out of state;
- \$50 million job growth grant fund.
- 5.38% pay raise for all state workers and a commitment that no state workers will make less than \$15 an hour.

PopUp Events H 1435/S 1954 by Rep Tom Leek & Sen Tom Wright assists local governments in responding to pop-up e.g. Truck events by authorizing the sheriff or chief county/city official to designate a special event zone in response for unpermitted events organized/promoted via a social media and attended by 50 or more persons and increases/disrupts the normal flow of traffic. It also prohibits excessive noise from motor vehicles. It came from the Ocean Center/town hall meeting after last year's Truck event. It takes effect upon becoming a law i.e. Governor's signature in order to address events coming to Daytona Beach in the next several weeks.

Law Enforcement Officer, Benefits, Recruitment, Training H 3 by Rep Tom Leek helps law enforcement agencies recruit/retain qualified officers via financial incentives, enhanced training, recognition that honors law enforcement officers' service to the State. It includes signing bonuses up to \$5,000 for new officers, and salary increases for county sheriffs.

Business Protection Act SB 620 Sen Travis Hutson allows businesses to sue cities/ counties for damages if new local rules/ regulations hurt their profits by 15% or more.

Businesses would be able to recoup up to seven years' worth of lost profits from local governments.



Local Ordinances SB 280 by Sen

Travis Hutson requires cities/counties to conduct business impact studies for every new ordinance passed.....and allow businesses more authority to block local laws from going into effect if that new rule/regulation could hurt their bottom lines.

Visit Florida SB 434 by Sen Hooper extends VISIT FLORIDA through 2028. Otherwise, VISIT FLORIDA would expire on October 1, 2023. Tourism is a key driver of Florida's \$1.23 trillion economy.

Special Session to Address Property Insurance Crisis?

House and Senate leaders couldn't agree on a solution to relieve homeowners of double-digit rate increases.

SB 1728 by Sen Boyd was the Senate's main property insurance reform bill. The property insurance industry is widely believed to be in crisis. Homeowners' rates have seen double digit increases over the last few years, and more than a dozen companies have recently suspended new business, and some have gone out of business.

The crux of the issue is high numbers of roof replacement claims that insurance execs say is the cause for rising prices.

Some companies are refusing to insure homes with older roofs.....remember the Assignment of Benefits bill in the 2019 session?

Gov DeSantis must sign/veto legislation within 7-15 days from the date it hits his desk or it becomes law without his signature. However, the governor veto can be overridden with a two-thirds majority vote in both House/Senate.



Georgia McKeown recaps the legislative session

The **Volusia Elected Officials Roundtable** meeting took place March 14. At the meeting, the idea of a transportation subcommittee of elected officials and citizens to consider options for growing infrastructure needs was discussed.

It was suggested if a group was put together that it considers a more comprehensive and citizen-based approach to tackling infrastructure needs in light of the failure of the 2019 half-cent sales tax referendum.

"That 2019 vote shows the public does not trust the political process. Any new entity needs to be a citizens-based committee".

It was suggested that they look at 2024 as a target but not necessarily another sales tax referendum. All funding sources should be considered not just another sales tax proposal.

All representatives at the meeting agreed to take the proposal back to their respective councils/commissions and suggest those interested in serving on the subcommittee contact **roundtable chair Heidi Herzberg**.

Also at this meeting, the County's Govt Affairs Liaison John Booker and Govt Affairs Consultant Georgia McKeown reported that legislative session saw 220 bills passed in addition to a \$112 billion budget. As for redistricting, new House and Senate districts were drawn and approved by the State Supreme Court.







Volusia School Supt Scott Fritz, will not extend his contract

Hired in December 2019, his three-year contract gives him a salary of \$205,000 annually.

At a recent Daytona Regional Chamber breakfast, Fritz stated that Volusia's HS graduation rate increased to from 87.7% to 91.2%. It was 71.7% in 2014-15. This rate included ALL student populations.

Fritz's contract expires in December. The next School Board meeting is April 12.

FAITH Proposing Housing Trust Fund with a Linkage Fee.....

A FAITH Action Assembly took place on March 28 with their primary focus being affordable housing.

FAITH (Fighting Against Injustice Toward Harmony) includes representatives from almost 30 religious congregations throughout Volusia County.

As Volusia's housing prices increase, the accessibility to affordable housing is less and less. Volusia's average one-bedroom apartment is \$955 a month, and a two-bedroom averages of \$1,488. Volusia's average wage is \$13 per hour which is below what's needed to meet these rents.

Thus, FAITH wants to create a housing trust fund.....

Last November, the County Council allocated \$2.5 million of Federal ARPA funds to create the trust fund.

However, <u>FAITH wants an additional \$1 million annually....</u> AND a dedicated revenue source i.e. a linkage fee based on a square foot amount of new developments.

FAITH reps will deliver housing trust fund petition signatures to the May 3 County Council. Stay tuned.

News from the Cities

DeLand City Commission Approves Resolution to Temporarily Slow Down Future Residential Annexations

It provides the City Commission a chance to evaluate options for regulating detached single family residential development of undeveloped lands including a new future land use category to provide for lower densities that may be more appropriate in certain areas of the City.

Commissioner Chris Cloudman stated, "It puts potential projects on pause to allow City staff the opportunity to catch up with backlog....to then bring more land-use designation options to the Commission."

nomic Development Corporation and the Central Fla Development Council.

Afterwards, he served as assistant city manager in Auburndale, and later became the City's Special Projects Director

He received a BA from Unv of Florida and MPA from Unv of South Florida.

Daytona Beach Purchasing Director Joanne Flick retired this past month after serving nearly 16 years in this position.





Official Florida House Districts Map





Official Florida Senate Districts Map







