## News from Tallahassee

### Special Session Approves Congressional Districts Map

Legislators met in Special Session **April 19-22** to redraw a congressional districts map. **Gov DeSantis** provided the House/Senate with a map that was approved.



**A federal Court will arguments regarding the proposed CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT map on May 12-13.**

However, two maps for Florida's congressional districts were submitted to this same federal court on April 18.

Both maps were filed as part of a federal court case filed by Common Cause, Fair Districts Now and several plaintiffs. The case asked for the federal court to step in and implement a map as opposed to the map proposed by **Gov DeSantis** and approved by the legislature.

The plaintiffs is asking the courts to consider a map ([S 8060](#)) passed by the Florida Senate **in January**.

### Gov DeSantis Calls Special Session on Property Insurance May 23-27

He wants the legislature to help stabilize Florida's troubled insurance market before hurricane season.

The Special Session will focus on ...

- Property insurance
- Reinsurance
- Changes to the building code to improve affordability of property insurance
- Office of Insurance Regulation
- Civil remedies

Homeowners' rates have spiked by double digits in some cases. With the hurricane season quickly approaching, there is concern of an unstable market, rising rates, limited coverage and diminishing options.

**State CFO Jimmy Patronis** said, “Many private insurance companies are dropping out of Florida- blaming fraudulent claims and lawsuits – which has led many homeowners to get policies with the state's Citizens Property Insurance.”



Property Insurance Special Session  
continued....

Legislation was approved in the 2021 regular session and some members believed those measures need time to stabilize the markets and rates.

However, the consensus was that *new* legislative measures are needed.

**Rep Tom Leek** said the property insurance industry in Florida has suffered a troubled last few years and fixing the system will take time and require several steps.



**Sen Tom Wright** sees three main components needed for property insurance reform...

- 1) Additional legal fee reform
- 2) Unscrupulous solicitation must be stopped and punished
- 3) Address deductibles on roofs or a stated value for

roofs or Actual Cash Value, which contemplates depreciation.

**New Constitutional Amendment Initiative Proposed for 2024**

[Florida Right to Clean Water.org](http://FloridaRighttoCleanWater.org) has proposed the initiative for the 2024 ballot.... that would create a “fundamental right to clean and healthy waters” and allow lawsuits against state agencies for harm or threatened harm to lakes, rivers, wetlands and other types of water bodies.

**Amendment to the Florida Constitution**

“State executive agencies are instrumental to the effort to protect Florida waters from harm and threatened harm”.


“Consequently, to promote the interests of Florida’s people, businesses, organizations, communities, and economies in clean and healthy waters, this section (part of the proposal) provides for equitable remedies against the actions or inactions of state executive agencies that harm or threaten harm to Florida waters, with the goal of clean and healthy waters and the aspiration that waters in the state will one day flourish.”

To reach the 2024 ballot, the committee must submit 891,589 valid petition signatures by a Feb. 1, 2024, deadline and receive approval of the ballot wording from the Florida Supreme Court.

## County/City News

### **County Discusses Growth Management/Permitting**

April 12, the County Council held a Growth Management/Permitting workshop. Staff updated Council members on land uses, building permits, and environmental management.

Since 1990, Volusia's population increased from 380,000 to 560,000 in 2020 (a 49% increase). Volusia's total acreage is 808,385 acres (695,669 acres of land and 112,716 acres of

water). Cities account for 215,467 acres, with 505,202 acres remaining in the unincorporated area. Approx 29% of the total land area is protected and held for conservation purposes, however, most of the development is occurring in cities.

Between 1990 and 2020 Volusia's population grew from 370,712 to 553,543 people....an increase of 182,831 people (6,000 new people per year) and 81,258 homes (2,709 homes per year).

Sheriff Mike Chitwood addresses local officials about opioid crisis in Volusia

### **Volusia Elected Officials Roundtable Meeting.....**

**Sheriff Mike Chitwood** spoke about the local impact of the Opioid crisis.

“It’s stretching resources of law enforcement entities as well as healthcare facilities”.

The **County’s John Booker** spoke on outcome on recent legislative Special Session that drew Congressional districts.

**Elections Supervisor Lisa Lewis** said once a map is approved by the Courts, the Volusia Elections Office will then prepare ballots based on new lines and precincts. All this must be done before candidate qualification, June 13.

**Govt Affairs Consultant Georgia McKeown** said 285 bills were approved. So far, Desantis has signed 104 and vetoed 2. He HAS signed the tax package which includes back-to-school tax-free holidays and no State Sales tax on gas during the month of October. Bills are STILL coming to him for his signature.

She also stated that **Gov Desantis** has not yet received the proposed \$112 billion budget.

Regarding the Formation of a Transportation Subcommittee, the group agreed to further discuss the idea AFTER the November elections...and that it be *citizen-led*.

**County Chair Jeff Brower** expressed reservations of proposing a new sales tax. **Pt Orange Mayor Don Burnette** said we have unmet infrastructure needs right now...

Next meeting will be ...September 12.

First Step Shelter Board Meeting - April 7

### **First Step Shelter seeking to implement new program to increase resident count**

**FSS is keeping 60 beds full every day and bringing in grants and donations.** FSS is also launching a new outreach program to get more homeless people on Volusia's east side learn about First Step and how get into the shelter.

So far, participants have been referred by a church, service agency and must pass a criminal background check.

This month, FSS has teamed up with the Sheriff's Office to begin a new outreach program that will serve as a hybrid of the current referral system and a 24-7 come-as-you-are model used by homeless shelters elsewhere.

FSS is hiring an outreach worker inform homeless individuals of their outdoor "safe zone" up to three nights...no obligations.

**FSS Exec Victoria Fahlberg** said they're implementing a system to call *individuals that reported* homeless individuals in the community. However, it was mentioned that no one can be forced to come to FSS just for being homeless.

***The local ACLU chapter stressed this point at a Daytona City Commission meeting (August 2018) when they argued against the City's trespass ordinance.***

Fahlberg stated that almost 2,700 people have used the Rose Ann Tornatore safe zone since it opened in late 2020.

At the meeting, it was reported FSS received several grants and donations totaling more than \$330,000 to help maintain their operations.

To date, 217 shelter residents have been placed in housing (each resident's average stay at the shelter is 3 months.... some remain little longer).

**April 19....**County Council heard an update regarding Economic Resources Budget from **Cyrus Callum and Helga Van Eckert.**

The Economic Development Division's overall budget is \$11,407,078 (Personnel Services \$ 969,369; Incentive Funding \$8.2 m BUT this is projected to decrease to \$540 K in FY 2022-23); Reserves \$1 m; and Operating Expenses \$ 1.2 m including:

- Economic Development Programs - \$669,500
- Team Volusia Contract: \$250,000
- UCF Incubator Agreement: \$250,000
- Sponsorships for Chambers, Associations (i.e. SCORE, SBDC, AAEA) \$169,500 Contracted Services - \$174,878 Legislative Services \$150K

There was extensive discussion as **County Chair Brower** had problems "giving tax dollars to new companies" However, **Councilmembers Ben Johnson and Danny Robins** stated, "performance based incentives are necessary to compete statewide....BUT should be awarded to prospective companies based on the number of jobs they generate at a specific wage amount."



### **FAITH Asks County Council for a Housing Trust Fund with a Linkage Fee.....**

FAITH (Fighting Against Injustice Toward Harmony) has representatives from almost 30 religious congregations throughout Volusia County. On May 3, FAITH formally requested the County Council to establish a \$2.5 million affordable housing trust fund.

They wanted to supplement this fund with an annual \$1 million to come from an linkage fee based on a dollar per square foot from new construction.



**Jim Judge, who served at Volusia's Emergency Management 2014-2021 was recently re-hired to serve as INTERIM director.** Emergency Management Director Helene Wetherington resigned effective April

14....so Judge will resume his position as head of emergency management.

During his tenure, he guided Volusia to its first ever full accreditation by the national Emergency Management Accreditation Program. He was at the EOC helm when Volusia withstood severe hurricanes in 2016 and 2017.

County staff is seeking applications for a new Director.

**The Volusia Hurricane Expo that was scheduled for May 21 has been cancelled. Look for the next Expo in 2023.**

April 21 - **DB City Commissioners extended Bike Week Master Plan boundaries** for properties on Mary McLeod Bethune Blvd from Ridgewood Avenue (US-1) to Fulton St. Doing so, it allows 33 properties, including Bethune-Cookman Univ to have outdoor entertainment and sales....adding more than a third of a mile to that eligible area.

Properties on the SE and NE corners of Ridgewood and Mary McLeod Bethune Blvd were added.

---

### **Howard Bailey selected to be Ormond Beach Fire Dept's next fire chief.**

He began as a volunteer firefighter with the Palm Coast Fire Dept in 1989. In 1992, he joined the Volusia County Fire Rescue and worked up through the ranks and was named Fire Chief in 2019. He will be retiring from the County and joining the City of Ormond Beach as the next Fire Chief on August 1, 2022.

He received a MPA from UCF and a BA in Organizational Management from Warner University. He is a member of the Volusia County, Florida and International Fire Chiefs Associations.

He's served as adjunct instructor at Flagler Technical Institute, Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, and Daytona State College.

### **DeLand Addresses Affordable Housing**

The City has experienced an increased demand for affordable housing. To help increase the inventory of housing units in the community, staff was directed to consider ways the City's Land Development Regulations could be revised to eliminate regulations that hamper new affordable housing units.

They're also seeking to encourage infill development in the core section of the city. Currently, the minimum size of single homes from 1,000 to 1,800 sq ft.....

discussion included considering 900 sq ft for all single family dwellings for all categories. To help foster affordable units, staff proposed sizes and Accessory Dwelling units.

---

April 4 - the **Edgewater City Council voted to create a Commercial Space Industry Opportunity Overlay Zone** as part of the city's economic development plan. It amends the city's Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use to include properties west of Interstate 95 along West Indian River Boulevard as well as properties between Park Ave and 10th St.

This amendment will include properties within the Commercial Space Industry Opportunity Overlay (CSIOO) to help City staff respond quickly to the space industry in an effort to market/attract potential space-related industries. The CSIOO must also consider flexibility in both land use patterns and location when siting these new industries. It's also a planning tool to identify non-residential areas in the City that are appropriate for aerospace businesses.










