Inauguration Ceremony

During his inaugural address, **Gov DeSantis** portrayed Florida as "a citadel for freedom," "where 'woke' goes to die," and as an overall model for the country. The inauguration ceremony had over 3,000 attendees.

He spoke of a "floundering federal establishment in Washington"

New County Council Members Assume Office

Five new County Council members....

Jake Johansson (At Large) Don Dempsey (Dist 1) Matt Reinhart (Dist 2) Troy Kent (Dist 4) and reelected Danny Robins (Dist 3) were sworn in. David Santiago (Dist 5) will be sworn in at a later meeting.

Council Chair Jeff Brower is midway in his 4 year term (2024).

Each spoke about the issues they'd like the Council to focus on during the next two years.

Most pressing issue....beach restoration and its impact on our tourist market.

Volusia's infrastructure roads, bridges, and water resources will be addressed as well.

Council meetings are the first and third Tuesdays, 9:30 am, County Admin Bldg, Deland.



SunRail's Extension to Deland.....

SunRail trains on a new 12-mile DeBary -DeLand stretch (under construction) should begin April or May next year. A SunRail depot will be built next to the AmTrak station.

Once completed, SunRail will run 61 miles from DeLand to Poinciana. Approx cost to Volusia -\$8.5 million.

Once this segment is complete, FDOT plans to

shift operating costs to the Central Fla Commuter Rail Commission (Volusia, Seminole, Orange, Osceola counties and Orlando). Staff has been adjusting the budget to accommodate this new expense.

It's likely that Lynx, the Orlando area bus system, will operate SunRail.

December 14 - Volusia County was officially declared a federal disaster area resulting from Hurricane Nicole which authorizes FEMA to provide individual assistance, public assistance and hazard mitigation.

Emergency Services Department Director Jim Judge, "With the Federal government taking responsive measures, those impacted by Nicole now have the opportunity to apply for help."

A Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) located at the Volusia Health Dept, 1845 Holsonback Dr, Daytona Beach...is assisting residents impacted by Hurricane Nicole. Hours 9 am - 6 pm. Monday - Saturday.

Congressman Michael Waltz is requesting federal funds for stormwater, flood protection and shore protection and beach renourishment projects in Volusia.

"North Central Florida needs federal Army Corps of Engineers projects to protect our coastal communities."



December 6 - Volusia County to receive \$5 million grant from Fla Dept of Environmental Protection to help with beach/dune sand placement as part of hurricane recovery efforts.

County Council approved grant agreement with FDEP regarding the beach's needs...mine sand from the Fla Inland Navigation pit.

The county is seeking to work with Army Corps of Engineers on future beach restoration projects.

Many of the County's 33 beach ramps and 140 walkovers have been reopened to increase public access to the beach. Tiger damns to temporarily to protect upland structures have been set in place.

Coastal damage is estimated at \$30 million — \$14 million (lan), \$16 million (Nicole).

December 20—County Council approved their Affordable Housing Advisory Committee's strategy recommendations to be included in their local housing assistance plan (LHAP), which governs the use of State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP) funding. Strategies adopted included......

- Expedite permits for affordable housing projects
- Set a process for local governments to consider policies, procedures, ordinances, regulations that decrease the cost of housing
- Allow flexibility in densities for affordable housing
- Allow affordable accessory residential units in residential zoning districts
- Allow flexible lot configurations (zero-lot-line configurations) for affordable housing
- Print an inventory of locally owned public lands suitable for affordable housing

- holding votes on term limits and border security bills....cap spending







News from Washington





Democrats have slim 51-49 majority over Republicans (note – that 51 includes 3 Independents that caucus with Democrats)......allowing advantages compared to the 50-50 split.

Democrats have majorities on committees, allowing them to process legislation and nominations much faster.....

Centrist Democrats may not hold as much power over Democrats' agenda. A two-seat majority margin allows Democrats more leeway to pass legislation without needing support moderates

WV Sen Joe Manchin and Ariz Sen Kyrsten Sinema(Independent)...both face reelection in '24.

VP Harris might not be needed as often to break tie votes on nominations and legislation, something she's done 26 times in the current 50-50 Senate.

Sen Kyrsten Sinema, Ariz, now registered an Independent, will still caucus with Democrats to their narrow vote majority in the Senate. 2 Senate Independents...Bernie Sanders (Vermont),





With the recent death of Virginia Democratic Rep. Donald McEachin, the new Congress will begin with 434 seats until there is a special election to fill that seat.

"Likely" Republican House Priorities

Try to roll back IRS funding boost i.e. repeal 87,000 IRS agents" — re \$80 billion funding boost for IRS in recent Inflation Reduction Act. Likely to be DOA in Democratic-controlled Senate.

Remove certain Democrats from committee assignments.....

- From the House Intelligence Committee.....
 - Reps Adam Schiff (D-Calif)
 differences in investigations about
 Trump and Eric Swalwell (D-Calif)...his
 relationship with alleged Chinese spy
 who fundraised for his 2014 campaign
 - **Rep Ilhan Omar (D-Minn)** from House Foreign Affairs Committee...antisemitic comments in the House.....

Speaker Nancy Pelosi removed GOP Reps Marjorie Taylor Greene (Ga), Paul Gosar (Ariz) from their committee posts. Removing a standing committee member requires vote of the full House.

- Investigate Homeland Security Secretary
 Alejandro Mayorkas re crisis at the southern border. Hardliners want him impeached.
- Create a <u>House Select Committee on China</u> regarding trade and military. This MAY be one of the few areas where the two parties can reach agreement.
- Pass a Washington version of Fla's Anti-WOKE bills i.e "Parents Bill of Rights" requiring school districts to post curriculum publicly. Again, Senate vote unlikely...

Democratic Priorities US Senate 2023 Priorities

- Increase child tax credit (CTC), that was expanded during pandemic before being allowed to lapse. A CTC deal MIGHT allow for research & development and interest payment write offs....
- Clean energy initiatives
- Affordable Housing
- Wage Equity
- Affordable Health Insurance

- enacting more regulatory change

Congress Approves \$1.7 Trillion Spending Bill

December 22 - <u>US Senate</u> voted 68-29 to pass a 4,155 page \$1.7 trillion omnibus package to cover a dozen annual government sectors (Sens Marco Rubio, Rick Scott voted NO) House voted 225-201 (Rep Michael Waltz voted NO).

It provides

- \$858 billion for defense spending.....
 - 10% increase over current funding
 - 4.6% pay bump for military personnel
- \$772.5 billion for nondefense, domestic programs
 - \$9 billion Centers for Disease Control
 - \$47 billion for Natl Institutes of Health
 - \$1.5 billion for cancer research
 - \$41 billion...natural disaster victims to assist communities recovering from natural disasters including hurricanes

NOTE – In addition to **Sens Manchin and Sinema**, watch 4 other US Senators who sometimes cross party lines......

Jon Tester (D-MT) - a moderate...supports boosting energy output...joined Republicans to rollback of Dodd-Frank banking regulations during the Trump administration...seen as <u>least liberal</u> Democratic Senators...Trump carried Montana in 2020.

Bernie Sanders (I-VT) lost to Biden in 2020 primary....self-described socialist...frequent progressive dissenter to Biden in Senate.....opposed Biden's plan to prevent railroad union strike....opposed weapons sale to Saudi Arabia...not ruled out 2024

Jacky Rosen (D-NV) - a moderate.....opposed Biden's COVID suppression measures e.g. mask mandate for public transportation...supported bill to declare an end to COVID national emergency....up for reelection in 2024.

Catherine Cortez Masto (D-NV) - was pivotal in getting Democrats 51 seats....had a close reelection.....differed with Biden's COVID policies..

A <u>filibuster</u> is used in the <u>U.S. Senate</u> to delay/ block a vote on a measure by preventing debate on it from ending. Very few restrictions...a senator who seeks recognition is entitled to speak for as long as they wish AND only when debate ends can a vote take place.

Senate Rules require 60 votes to invoke cloture i.e. limit debate on a bill for a further 30 hours.

In practice, most bills cannot pass the Senate without the support of at least 60 senators.

Recent changes were made to allow the <u>nuclear</u> <u>option</u>, which lets Senate to override its own 60 -vote Standing Rule, by simple majority.






Mean high-water: The average height of the high waters over a 19-year period. For shorter periods of observation, "mean high-water" means the average height of the high waters after corrections are applied to eliminate known variations and to reduce the result to the equivalent of a mean 19-year value. Mean high-water line: The intersection of the tidal plane of mean highwater with the shore.

The Daytona Beach City Commission voted 6 –1 to amend City Code relating to hookah bars and other types of smoking lounges. It requires smoking lounges to close at midnight un-



less they obtain an extended hours permit, which would allow them to remain open until 2 am (or 3 AM during certain designated special event periods)....same as businesses that serve alcohol.

Mayor Henry, Commissioners Paula Reed, Stacy Cantu, Monica Paris, Ken Strickland, Quanita May voted YES; Dannette Henry voted NO.

December 19 – **DeLand City Commission** amended their **Panhandling Ordinance** by adding the new intersections to where panhandling is pro-

hibited. This will include parcels and road right-ofway.....within 50 feet (measured from the stop bar at each lane).



To date, Daytona Beach, Port Orange and Deland have panhandling ordinances.

Dec 14 - Volusia Soil & Water Conservation District is recommending the County Council push Volusia County's Coastal



Construction Control Line 50' west from the beach.

Fla's CCCL location is based on coastal engineering models, scientific principles that determine the potential upland damage of a 100-year storm event. It varies wildly along the beachside...splitting buildings to west of A1A.

Since 1991, Volusia's CCCL lies approx 250' east of A1A, splitting many beachfront properties. A 50' westward move would curtail most new

Since 2019, eight companies have gone insolvent...others have stopped writing new policies or pulled out of Fla which led to homeowners' premiums three times the national average.

Or- Altmaier believes the recent legislation <u>will even-tually</u> lead to lower premiums.

Why are State Dept Administrators Resigning?

NOTE – BEGINNING Jan 1, 2023.....Legislators and judges who leave office are **prohibited from lobbying the Legislature or executive branch for SIX years** per <u>HB 7001</u> and <u>HB 7003</u> (both would implement a constitutional amendment passed by voters in 2018).

It ALSO applies to leaders of state agencies under DeSantis or the Cabinet (ex-lawmakers/agency heads can still lobby city and county governments).

The prohibitions would also include:

- Statewide elected officers;
- Members of the Legislature;
- County Commissioners/Councilmembers;
- Constitutional county officers charter officers;
- School board members/superintendents;
- Elected municipal officials,
- Secretaries, executive directors, other administrative heads of executive branch departments

said FEMA has approved \$72 million for housing repairs and \$64 million for housing grants. **SBA's Mary Anne Bradfield** said they have direct loans up to \$2 million for business and \$200,000 for homes to cover what FEMA does not.






Official Florida House Districts


Volusia area




Florida Senate Districts 7 and 8 Volusia area




Congressional Districts 6 and 7
