Jan 7 - the Volusia Legislative delegation including Sens Tom Wright, Tom Leek....Reps Webster Barnaby, Chase Tramont, Bill Partington, Richard Gentry..... hosted its annual meeting to hear recommendations from the county, cities, school board, local agencies and other entities for the up-increasing number of launches coming Session in Tallahassee.

More than 100 speakers representing Cities, the County, School Bd, Higher Educ Institutions, Chambers of Commerce, and other entities relayed their requests to the delegation

County Council Chairman Jeff Brower spoke of streamlining the state's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program to target stormwater and flood mitigation programs

DB Shores Mayor Nancy Miller, S Daytona Mayor Bill Hall, Ormond Beach Mayor Jason Leslie spoke of the same.

Funding for storm recovery and infrastructure were MAJOR topics.

Daytona Regional Chamber's David Robinson spoke of Property Insurance Affordability and Accessibility.. Affordable Housing... Workforce Availability/Training..Economic Development Funding..Infrastructure/ Road Improvements.. Adequate funding for educational entities...Affordable Healthcare Insurance.

**ERAU President Barry Butler** requested funding for aviation/aerospace research.

Space Florida CEO Rob Long funding for spaceport infrastructure to support the

County Council will convene a special meeting Tuesday, Jan 14, 4 PM County Admin Bldg, DeLand to discuss a possible development moratorium in Volusia County.

On Nov 19, the County Council was to discuss a possible countywide moratorium on residential development and to require Low Impact Development Standards and reevaluate stormwater management practices.



After several hours of comments, the Council approved a motion directing staff to rekindle a plan for Council review that concentrates on overhauling existing stormwater pipelines, drains, sewers/canals to address flooding.

Council ALSO agreed to revisit this issue on January 14 at a special meeting which was would include public comment and a possible vote.

# Dec 4 - **DB City Commission approved a Residential Rental Registration Program which applies to all owners of one to four residential units.**

It requires property owners to register their units annually with pertinent information....opting for a voluntary inspections which would assist code enforcement and address health, safety, and welfare issues.

Dec 4 - DB City Commission heard from a consultant regarding a proposed new \$185 million sports complex to be located on 600 acres of city-owned property adjacent to the First Step Shelter (west of I-95). They're talking a 10,000-seat football/soccer stadium, basketball tennis and pickleball courts, baseball fields, a pool, an ice rink, and concessions.

They're looking at a variety of funding options...including school district, local tourism tax dollars, partnerships with local univserities, as well as other sources. The project aims to boost sports tourism and generate significant economic impact for the area

Jan 7 - Daytona Beach Shores City Commission updated their Land Development Code, the permit fee schedule. DB Shores has not substantially



updated building permit inspection/plan review fees since 2001.



Jan 6 – by a 3-1 vote, Edgewater will implement a moratorium on new development projects for the next year to address flooding concerns. With a packed house, this came after extensive public comment and debate. The intent is to give officials time to update land development codes, stormwater master plans, and flood vulnerability assessments.


It suspends building permits in the Fla Shores Drainage Basin if the project adds an impervious surface. The focus is to curtail stormwater runoff and lessen flooding problems that have inundated the area after recent storms.

Habitat for Humanity expressed concern that no new affordable housing permits will be reviewed/ approved in this time frame. Meanwhile, City Hall has been considering various long-term resolutions i.e. their stormwater system needs an overhaul. Staff will have to work quickly since hurricane season starts in June.

Edgewater City Councilman Rob Wilkie an-

nounced his resignation, effective January 6, 2025.

Every business registered to do business heremust file an annual report with Fla Dept of State.

Updating your info with Fla's Secretary of State ensures that your business is active and authorized to do business in the State.

Furthermore, it informs the public of your company's leadership info....allows you to update the names and/or addresses of the officers/ directors, managers, registered agent, contact info and federal EIN number.

You can file online through the State's Division of Corporations website. Click here to file your 2024 annual report.



# Where Fla Elections/Appointments Stand Now

A primary for Congressional District 6 Democrat and Republican candidates will be held Jan 28 Republican candidates include

- State Senator Randy Fine Brevard Cty
- Aaron Baker Lake Cty
- Ehsan Joarder of Hernando Cty

Democrat candidates will include....

- Ges Selmont St Johns County
- Josh Weil Orange Cty
- Purvi Bangdiwala Daytona Bch (withdrew)

Afterwards, **Libertarian candidate Andrew Parrott** and **NPA candidate Randall Terry** will run in the April 1 general election.

Dist 6 includes northern Volusia, Flagler, St Johns and parts of Putnam counties. State law says you need not live in the Congressional District per se only the state to run for office.

For now, House Republicans have a 217-215 majority until 3 seats are filled this Spring.

Congressional District 1 (the Panhandle) has **State CFO Jimmy Patronis** from Panama City running upon receiving Donald Trump's endorsement. This



means Gov DeSantis will have to make an appointment to fill the State CFO position.

State Senator <u>Joe Gruters</u> (he's been endorsed by President-elect Trump for the position and has support from

Jimmy Patronis)..he's filed to run in 2026....

**State Senator Blaise Ingoglia..** currently serving until 2026...district includes Citrus, Hernando, Sumter counties and part of Pasco county

**State Representative Mike Caruso...** first elected 2918...currently serving until 2026 from Palm Beach County.....

With Senator Marco Rubio being selected to become Secretary of State, Gov DeSantis must appoint an individual to serve the remainder of his term (2028).

A few potential candidates being considered include:

- Lieutenant Governor Jeanette Núñez
- Florida Attorney General Ashley Moody





- US Rep Laurel Lee (there'd be another special election to fulfill her term)
- Republican Party's Laura Trump took her name out of consideration.

### Two Candidates Announce for Fla Senate 2026

State Senate District 8 currently held by Sen Tom
Wright who'll be termed
out.....County Council At
Large member Jake Johansson announced that he'll be
running for District 8. He'll be
running against Elizabeth
Fetterhoff, a former State
House member represent-





ing Volusia. District 8 covers south Granada Ave encompassing Volusia and part of Brevard.



Congress approved a newly revised government funding bill/continuing resolution to fund the federal govt until March 14. The House vote was 366-34.

Congressmen Mike Waltz and Cory Mills voted against the bill citing concerns over govt spending and the need for single-subject bills. The Senate passed the same bill early Saturday morning 85 to 11. Senators Marco Rubio and Rick Scott both voted against the bill for the same reasons.

The spending bill funds the federal government through March 2025. Key provisions include:

- \$100 billion for disaster relief to help citizens recover from natural disasters.
- **a** one-year extension providing \$30 billion in aid to farmers.
- It does NOT include a provision to raise the debt ceiling, which was a contentious issue during negotiations.

This bill prevents a federal govt shutdown and ensures continued funding for essential services. **President Biden** signed it December 21.



Mike Johnson retained his position as House Speaker by a 218-215-1 vote after President-elect Donald Trump endorsed his re-election. Congressmen Mike Waltz and Cory Mills voted YES.

Johnson had opposition from some GOP members who expressed concern regarding his past decisions on government spending.

Now that the House Speaker is elected, the House can conduct official business. Currently, the House has 219 Republicans and 215 Democrats.



Special House elections will take place in the next several

weeks after Trump selected 3 members for positions in his administration (**Cong Michael Waltz** for National Security Advisor...**NY Congresswoman Elise Stefanik** to for UN Ambassador..**Cong Gaetz** later resigned).

Congress is expected to take up the extension of the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA). House Ways/ Means Committee wants swift action to extend these tax cuts, as several provisions are set to expire at the end of 2025. However, there are concerns about the potential impact on the federal deficit and the need for corresponding spending cuts.

### Property Tax Collection is year-round...

On average since, 2020\*

- 4% are paid in installments

to taxing authorities in the County.

The Senate recently passed the Social Security Fairness Act with a vote of 76-20. It eliminates two provisions of current law:


 the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP)....enacted in 1983, adjusted Social Security benefits for public workers receiving pensions



 the Government Pension Offset (GPO)...enacted in 1977, affected Social Security benefits for spouses/ widows receiving pensions.

The repeal of these provisions will benefit publicsector workers such as teachers, police officers, and firefighters. However, it also raises concerns about the overall solvency of the Social Security system, as it could accelerate the system's insol-

vency by six months.



Sen Rick Scott voted in favor and Sen Marco Rubio did not vote on the bill.

President Biden's signed the bill into law.



JC Consulting Supports Isreal! Always will...Dammit! Anyone got a problem with that? The International Longshoremen's Assn (ILA) and US Maritime Alliance (USMX) are facing a January 15 deadline to negotiate a new contract. The main issue is automation, with the ILA opposing it due to job security concerns, while the USMX argues it's necessary for efficiency and competitiveness.

### President-elect Donald Trump

has shown support for the union's stance against automation.



If an agreement isn't reached by January 15, a strike could occur, potentially disrupting port operations and impacting the supply chain.

The International Longshoremen's Association (ILA) operates at several major ports in Florida, including:

- JAXPORT in Jacksonville
- Port Everglades in Fort Lauderdale
- PortMiami
- Port Tampa Bay

These ports are among the busiest in the state and play a crucial role in the maritime industry.



# That damn national debt is still there and growing!

US national debt is now \$36.3 trillion....a \$2.5 trillion increase in 2024 and "it's gonna keep rising"....estimates suggest it could reach \$37 trillion by May.

House Speaker Mike Johnson indicated that congressional Republicans plan to increase the nation's borrowing limit as part of a massive bill that will address concerns about using the debt limit as leverage during Trump's administration.

A rising national debt "ain't good" for the economy....

- As the debt grows, so do the government's "credit card" interest payments that must be paid which can mean higher taxes or reduced govt spending on essential services/programs.
- High levels of government borrowing can mean higher interest rates, which can crowd out private investment. Thus, businesses/individuals may pay more to borrow money for investments, potentially slowing economic growth.
- If the government finances its debt by printing more money, it can lead to inflation i.e. higher prices for goods/services.
- A high national debt limits government's ability to address economic crises or invest in long-term projects. It can also lead to reduced confidence in the government's ability to manage its finances, thus affect the country's credit rating.



Taxes become delinquent on April 1, at which point a 3% minimum mandatory charge is added to the gross amount



Price of home insurance increases 3.1%

Home insurance costs in Florida did indeed spike in the 3rd quarter of 2024, with the statewide average pre-

mium for a single-family home policy increasing by 3.1% between the 2nd and 3rd guarters. This follows 2 straight quarters of smaller increases, which experts attributed to a decrease in lawsuits, a mild 2023 hurricane season, and lower hikes in the cost of reinsurance.

However, it's uncertain whether this 3.1% spike indicates a new upward trend for 2025. Factors such as rising home prices, inflation, and contin-



The **next Federal Reserve Bd meeting is January 28-29** which will focus on several key topics:

- Monetary Policy: Federal
   Open Market Committee
   (FOMC) will discuss the current state of the economy and make decisions on interest rates.
- Economic Projections: review/update their economic projections, including GDP growth, unemployment rates, inflation forecasts.
- Financial Stability: Discussions on maintaining financial stability and addressing any risks to the financial system.
- Regulatory Updates: Updates on regulatory policies and any changes needed to ensure stability of the financial system.

The meeting will conclude with a press conference where Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell will provide insights into the committee's decisions and outlook for the economy.

Will the Fed cut interest rates again? While there is speculation that the Fed may cut rates to support economic growth, *the final decision will depend on the latest economic data and projection*.

The Federal Reserve Bd met December 17–18 and cut the target federal funds rate by 25 basis points to a range of 4.25% to 4.50%.

Federal Reserve Board's target federal funds rate and bank lending rates to consumers are related but distinct concepts:

Federal Funds Rate set by the Federal Reserve
 Bd is a target range which influences overall economic activity.

Bank Lending Rates to Consumers are the interest rates that banks for mortgages, auto loans, and personal loans. These rates are influenced by the federal funds rate but also depend on other factors i.e. bank's cost of funds, a borrower's credit score, and market conditions.

Federal Reserve Board's target federal funds rate VS bank's lending rates to consumers

In summary, the **federal funds rate** is a <u>bench-mark rate set</u> by the Federal Reserve that influences the broader interest rate environment, while **bank lending rates to consumers** are the <u>actual rates charged to borrowers, which can vary based on multiple factors</u>.







Recently, US GAO warned the national debt is growing at a rate that threatens the vitality of our nation's economy AND will more than double over the next 30 years ..." poseing serious economic/security problems if not addressed".

Most of the growth in government spending is three things.....

- Social Security,
- healthcare (Medicare/Medicaid),
- interest on the debt.

In 2000, US national debt was just \$3.4 trillion..... about one-third of annual gross domestic product. Back then, the Congressional Budget Office felt it could be wiped out completely within a decade.

Today it's \$36.1 trillion....nearly 100% of GDP.... highest level since World War II. On the current trajectory it will hit 200% of GDP by 2050.

Despite economic growth, FY 2024 deficit was \$1.83 trillion, 5th year in a row of a deficit above \$1 trillion.

Projections show the federal government will pay more than \$1 trillion in net interest costs starting in 2029. The recent rise in net interest spending has been driven by higher interest rates.

GAO has previously suggested that Congress develop a plan to address the government's unsustainable fiscal path.

Citizens Proprty Insurance is considering significant increases to its premiums subject to approval of the Office of Insurance Regulation.

The amount of the premium increase depends on the current premium and type of policy. This increase will vary by county. Not sure what type of increase Volusia's policy holders will see.

**Citizens' Property Insurance Policies Dropped from 1.1 million to 987,744 this month.** Citizens, state-backed insurer of last resort, shifted 237,323 personal -line policies and 1,527 commercial-line policies to private insurers in October i.e. "depopulation" program.

Citizens' also announced that 12 private sector insurance carriers participated in depopulation efforts between October and December, including five new entrants to the market this year.

Another 343,000 policies could be assumed by other insurance carriers and taken out of Citizens by February.

Citizens reached as many as 1.412 million policies last year as the depopulation program continued.

State leaders want to minimize the number of policies in Citizens, because of financial risks if the state gets hit by a major hurricane(s). Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund has about \$7 billion in reserves.

If Citizens wouldn't have enough money to pay claims, policyholders throughout the state — including possibly non-Citizens policyholders — could have to pay "assessments" to cover the costs.

Officials expect the number of Floridians insured by Citizens to drop to nearly 900,000 by the end of the year



401 K plans now allow \$23,500. For 2025, annual contribution limit for 401 (k) plans has been increased to \$23,500 for employees under 50. For those aged 50 and over, the catch-up contribution limit remains at \$7,500, making total potential contribution \$31,000.



2024 was First Step Shelter's busiest year to date. Daily census increased 67% from January (60 individuals) to December at full capacity (100 individuals). FSS had 544

residents in the shelter program (annual total) vs 357 (2023 total). The Rose Ann Tornatore Safe Zone had 844 visitors (annual total) vs 636 (2023 total).
